About University

Kavikulaguru Kalidas Sanskrit University (KKSU) was established on 18 September 1997. It is named to pay rich tribute to Legendary Sanskrit Mahakavi Kalidasa. KKSU is an institution dedicated to the advanced learning of Sanskrit. It is located at Ramtek which falls under Nagpur District, the second capital of Maharashtra. It is the first Sanskrit University of Maharashtra.

History of Establishment: The former Prime Minister of India, P.V. Narasimha Rao, who is the great Scholar of Sanskrit, was keen on setting up an independent Sanskrit University in Maharashtra. With encouragement from Mr. Rao, the late CM of Maharashtra Shri S. Naik took up the issue and appointed Dr. S. Jichkar as one member committee to give a study report for establishing the Sanskrit University in Maharashtra. Dr. Jichkar prepared the study report and a non-formal University act for the establishment of Sanskrit University in Maharashtra. One of the Prominent Scholar of Sanskrit and Eminent personality of Vidarbha region Dr. Pankaj Chande was the Founder Vice-Chancellor of Kavikulaguru Kalidas Sanskrit University.

The UGC recognized University with 12B & 2f status and accredited by NAAC with B++. It gives recognition to the educational institution for specialized studies in the jurisdiction of Maharashtra & Goa. It is a prominent research centre for researchers.

- ✓ KKSU promotes the use of Sanskrit and is working hard to propagate the importance of Sanskrit through various projects and initiatives in order to reach and touch each individual life.

- ✓ Kavikulaguru Kalidas Sanskrit University has many distinct features among Sanskrit Universities in the country. The university in its vision and mission statements clearly defines its areas, functions and research focus.

Sanskrit for All

- ✓ While having the entire Maharashtra state as its jurisdiction, the university is catering to the needs in the field of education in many modern disciplines like Yoga, Public Administration, Computer Applications, Library Science, Social work, Education, Hospitality Management, Fine Arts, and Performing Arts and so on through various academic programs in direct mode and distance mode also. It has made Sanskrit reachable to all irrespective of age, caste, creed or gender. .
- ✓ All these modern programs have content from Ancient Indic Wisdom along with 20% content from Sanskrit directly.
- ✓ Apart from this, the university is offering more than 50 certificate and diploma programs in various subjects including Naturopathy, Panchakrma Chikitsa, Vastuvidya etc. with a blend of subjects to suit for contemporary skilling programs.

Sanskrit for Future

- ✓ The University is marching towards making the Sanskrit content available to modern fields of studies and disciplines. In this aspect, the university is engaging with other modern universities.
- ✓ A number of Memorandum of Understanding and Agreements is signed with many other academic institutions. KKSU and Maharashtra Law University together are offering a Certificate program in Shastric Methodology of Argumentation for legal practitioners with a view to provide the basis of Shastric approach.
- ✓ Apart from this, the University is exploring possibilities in many fields like Computational Linguistics, Yoga Therapy, Vastuvidya and Architecture etc. This will create a road map for Sanskrit development with future aspirations of education in the nation.
- ✓ In this direction, KKSU has already started PG programs such as M.A. in Multidisciplinary Sanskrit, M.A. in Jyotish and Astronomy, M.Sc. in Yogic Science in its new Campus at Waranga near Nagpur.
- ✓ These programs will open up new avenues for Sanskrit studies involving many modern areas of studies.

Objectives

 - (a) Sublime relationship between the teacher and the taught (Guru-ShishyaParampara- the noble Indian tradition indicative of a sense of deep gratitude and reverence towards Acharyas who conferred the bliss of fulfillment on their disciples in pursuit of learning, in quest of Truth);
 - (b) Innovative methods of studies and experimentation in which true spirit of curiosity search for knowledge (Jignyasha) and selfdiscipline (Svayam-Shasana) are fundamental components; and
 - (c) Development of faculties, not only of empirical and rational views but also or higher levels of consciousness that unifies the two;
- (3) To encourage and promote innovation, research and discovery in all fields of Sanskrit learning which aims at linking the past with the present and enables the nation to meet the challenges of the future.
- (4) To develop as a Light House to imbibe the integrated (holistic) vision of life through inter- disciplinary approach; and impart this vision to the teachers community and key-persons working in order fields for reawakening and regeneration of India.

Rules for admission

- 1. The candidates seeking admission should send the application in the prescribed form.
- 2. The candidates must enclose the following documents along with the application, failing which the application will be summarily rejected.
- Self-attested Xerox copies of the following certificates
 - i. Provisional/Original pass certificates of the last qualifying examination.
 - ii. Marks obtained in each examination right from Matriculation/SSC/HSSC to the last qualifying examination
 - iii. Date of birth certificate
 - iv. Study certificate
 - iv. Caste certificate
 - v. Conduct certificate
 - vi. Aadhar card
- Incomplete applications or those received after the due date will be rejected. The office of the University will not be held responsible for delay of application forms sent by post.
- The candidate must know that if he/she wants to cancel the admission before one month only 10 % fee will be deducted from the submitted fees and no amount will be refunded after one month.
- Students will be admitted to the University in accordance with the rules governing eligibility, merit, good conduct etc.,
- Students will not be allowed to change the optional subject after one month from the date of joining.
- The University reserves the right to run or not to run any programme during the year depending on the number of applications received for a particular Programme.
